

Privacy Notice and Data Retention Policy

Last updated: 19 September 2026

This website hosts a petition concerning human rights, the rule of law, due process, democratic participation, and public security in Bangladesh, as described in the petition text addressed to the UK Prime Minister.

This notice explains how personal data submitted through the petition website is collected, used, stored, and deleted.

Petition organiser

This petition is organised by **Sonjoy Kumar Roy**. Sonjoy Kumar Roy is the person responsible for the personal data collected through this petition website in connection with petition signatures, related administration, and any privacy requests made by signatories.

Personal data collected

When a person signs the petition, the website may collect the following information:

- Full name
- Email address
- Country of residence
- Postcode or constituency, where requested
- Date and time of signature
- Any optional message submitted by the signer
- Limited technical information such as IP address, browser, and device data for security and anti-fraud purposes

Why the data is used

Personal data submitted through the petition is used only for legitimate campaign administration purposes connected with the petition. These purposes include:

- Verifying and counting genuine signatures
- Preventing duplicate, fraudulent, or automated submissions
- Demonstrating support for the petition to relevant UK decision-makers
- Responding to enquiries, corrections, or deletion requests

- Sending campaign updates only where a signer has separately agreed to receive them

Political sensitivity

By signing this petition, a person may reveal views on political and public-interest issues connected with Bangladesh. Because of that, the information must be handled carefully, used only for petition-related purposes, and not reused for unrelated marketing or disclosure beyond what is explained in this notice.

How the information may be shared

The petition may be presented to relevant UK decision-makers, public authorities, elected representatives, or related offices as evidence of support for the issues raised in the petition.

In doing so, the organiser may share the overall number of verified signatures and, where appropriate, signatory information necessary to support the petition submission.

Personal contact details such as email addresses, phone numbers, IP addresses, and other technical data will not be published publicly and should not be disclosed to petition recipients unless there is a clear lawful basis and the signer has been properly informed.

Trusted service providers such as website hosts, database providers, email delivery services, security services, or anti-spam providers may process data on behalf of the organiser only for the operation and protection of the petition website.

Email use

The email address provided by a signer should be used only to administer the petition, help verify signatures, prevent duplicates or abuse, respond to data requests, and send campaign updates where the signer has specifically opted in.

Email addresses should not be used for unrelated promotional activity.

Data retention

Personal data must not be kept for longer than necessary. For this petition website, the following retention approach is appropriate:

- **Verified petition signatures:** retained until the campaign has concluded and for up to 12 months afterwards for verification, reporting, and follow-up administration
- **Unverified or incomplete submissions:** retained for up to 7 days, then deleted automatically if not confirmed or needed
- **Campaign email opt-in records:** retained until the person unsubscribes or consent is withdrawn
- **Security and anti-fraud logs:** retained for up to 90 days unless required for an active investigation
- **Backup copies:** removed through the normal backup cycle within up to 90 days after deletion from active systems

At the end of the relevant retention period, the data will be securely deleted or anonymised so that individuals are no longer identifiable.

Deletion and erasure requests

Individuals may request access to their personal data, correction of inaccurate data, or deletion of their information where applicable under UK GDPR. Requests can be sent to contact@ukpetition.com.

The right to erasure applies in certain circumstances, including where personal data is no longer necessary for the purpose for which it was collected or where consent is withdrawn. However, minimal records may need to be retained for a limited period where necessary to prevent duplicate signatures, resolve disputes, maintain security, or comply with legal obligations.

Security measures

Access to signatory data should be limited to authorised persons who need it to operate and administer the petition. Appropriate technical and organisational measures should be used to protect information against unauthorised access, misuse, alteration, or loss, including secure hosting, HTTPS, access controls, and strong account security.

Individual rights

Under UK GDPR, individuals have the right to be informed about how their data is used and may also have rights to access, rectify, erase, restrict, or object to processing depending on the circumstances. Individuals also have the right to complain to the UK Information Commissioner's Office if they believe their information has been handled unlawfully.

Updates to this notice

This notice may be updated if the petition process, website features, or data-handling practices change. The latest version should remain available on the website so signatories can review the current terms before submitting their information.
